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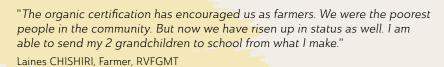
THE COMITTEE LINKING ENTREPRENEURSHIP-AGRICULTURE-DEVELOPMENT

These activities to support a group of 200 producers in Zimbabwe were implemented under the Fit For Market programme funded by the European Union, the Organisation of African, Caribbean and Pacific States and co-financed by the French Development Agency.

Through its development programmes, COLEAD provides, online and in the field, technical assistance, vocational training and support services in regulatory monitoring, market insights, partnerships, research and innovation and access to finance.

Impact on agricultural and environmental practices

Average scores for food quality/ safety increased from 65% to 84% in the past three years, scores for good agricultural practices and soil management also increased by 15 points over the same period.

Impact on social practices

100% of our beneficiary partners surveyed are implementing the main lessons from COLEAD training. In these organisations/companies, 50.5% of employees are women, and the ratio of women in management positions is 39.4%.

Economic impact

90% of COLEAD partners have seen an improvement in their employees' livelihoods and have created direct employment, 74% have made an investment in the past 3 years, and profitability has increased from 16% to almost 25%.
